

Michael Karibian: A Retrospective July 5th - September 1st

Join us in a celebration of the work of distinguished artist, Michael Karibian, who contributed greatly to the fabric of our local arts community. Beloved and past member of Spectrum Art Gallery, Karibian was featured in exhibitions not only at Spectrum, but also the Fresno Art Museum, and Fig Tree Gallery.

Although he has passed on, his amazing work continues to inspire with this retrospective exhibition featuring some of the highlights of his versatile career: During his tour in Vietnam in 1969 he served as photographer for "Stars and Stripes." With extensive Airforce training, he tackled everything from photographing generals shaking hands, troop movements in the field, to Agent Orange deployment and its results. While in Saigon, his camera turned to life in the streets and the souls he encountered. He came away with a mindset even more devoted to peace and tolerance. Coming from a heritage of those who escaped genocide, he listened, empathized, and later recorded Armenian elders' stories accounting the horrors leading to the diaspora that enabled his generation precious opportunities to thrive in peace.

After military service with both a BA and MFA, he pursued a long and successful career as a professional photographer. To name a few, his clients ranged from California State University, Fresno, UC Merced, the Fresno Art Museum, major regional hospitals, The Big Fresno Fair, California Agricultural Industry, the Honor Flight for Veterans traveling to Washington D.C., to portraits of dignitaries, musicians, artists and their works.

As an avocation, he took great joy in listening and creating music with guitar and mandolin. Words and music were often integrated with his visuals in such ways that streams of consciousness could flow. Sketches, freeform poetry, memoirs, and Illustrated notebooks were developed as well as some very limited editions of custom-made books.

The visitors to this exhibition will have the opportunity to experience a cross-section of Michael Karibian's unique life in photography through this collection of his finely crafted originals.

Fresno Airport Satellite Exhibition

This exhibition is for Summer 2024 and will include 10 artists this rotation. Subject matter must be flight-friendly for travelers. Flight-Friendly can be considered calming views and colors. Should not have lightning strikes, wildfires, animal attacks, etc. The City of Fresno wants to be inclusive of artworks within the Airport, but please keep in mind that travelers are there to fly, not necessarily to look at art. Please do not "push the envelope," but instead submit works that would be a good, strong fit for a public viewing.

$\hfill \square$ All works sold will be fulfilled by the artist once the exhibit closes.
$\hfill \square$ Spectrum Art Gallery retains 35% commission from sales.
\Box All works must be framed and matted with a single 4-ply over mat to gallery standards.
Window cuts can be any size to fit your works but frame size should not be smaller than 11x14 and no larger than 30x30.

- Attend monthly board meetings.
- Provide financial report(s) (bank account balance and any info board should know about current finances)
- Enter payroll in Quickbooks online: input employee hours from timesheet. The hourly rate is already set up. QB automatically deducts taxes for you.
- Pay bills: most bills are set up with autopay. There are a few that need to be paid by check (rent) and that are due every other month (utility bill). Send receipts to Bookkeeper for record keeping.
- Quickbook reports: These reports are pre-made within Quickbooks.
- Run profit & loss reports quarterly.
- Run end of year customer donations to email their annual receipts.
- Taxes: Our taxes are done online through their respective agency websites.

Reports pre-made in Quickbooks. Calendar reminders are on the drive. Can use previous taxes as a guide. Linda Knight and Bookkeeper will help also.

- File Federal and state income tax returns.
- Quarterly state sales tax returns; city and sales.
